Warwick Market is every Saturday from 9am. Farmers' Markets are usually on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Saturdays of the month.

During the summer there is an additional market on Wednesdays.

#### The latest rules from the government - in England

On July 19<sup>th</sup> all Covid legal restrictions in England ended. But the government says people should proceed with 'extreme caution'. On 14<sup>th</sup> September the PM announced that 12 to 15 year-olds will get single vaccinations, and a booster jabs are now being offered to over-50s as supplies allow. ('Plan A'). If the NHS is in danger of being overwhelmed, 'Plan B' would be the reintroduction of some measures, as yet unspecified.

Self isolation: Since 16<sup>th</sup> August, people who've had both their jabs will no longer have to self-isolate after close contact with someone who tests positive. If contacted, you are advised to take a PCR test as soon as possible. As long as that is negative, you won't need to take any further action. If positive you must self-isolate for 10 days.

Holidays abroad: At present, fully vaccinated people returning to England from other countries are no longer required to self-isolate. Anyone who's fully vaccinated will no longer have to take a PCR test before travelling to England.
